In Class

The main areas of learning that the children will be focusing on will be:

Maths – we will be solving problems that involve weight, capacity and length. We will be using everything we have learned to be critical thinkers and problem solvers.

Literacy - we will be story mapping 'The Rainbow fish' using 3D story maps and drawing pictures.

Phonics - we will be learning the 'irregular' words 'were, there, what'. We will be reading and writing sentences using these 'irregular' words.

Discover - we will be creating fish using a range of materials (cardboard, lentils, beans, paint) and techniques (cutting, sticking using liquid glue, painting).

Please can you bring in 3 pieces of junk that we can use to create a whole class piece of art. Something that can be easily stuck down, for example crisp packets, used foil etc.
